


MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

BIENNIAL CONVENTION OF PIMA HELD IN LAHORE-PAKISTAN; ATTRACT THOUSANDS OF MEDICS

The biennial convention of PIMA concluded on 1st April 2018 in Lahore. The two days historic convention was attended by around 2000 doctors from all corners of the country and abroad. The galaxy of national and international speakers comprised of renowned figures and authorities in their clinical and academic areas of expertise and excellence. FIMA fraternity was also invited as guest speakers in various session, headed by the FIMA President Dr. Ihsan Karaman from Turkey and Prof Aly Mishal, the executive director of FIMA from Jordan and Dr Musa Nordin chairman of FIMA Advisory council from Malaysia.

The convention was preceded by 5 very well attended pre-conference workshops comprising of "Transfusion Medicine: Hands on update and techniques" conducted in the Children Hospital and Institute of Child Health Lahore coordinated by Prof. Dr. Nisar Ahmad. The workshop on

"Management of Hepatitis C in the era of direct acting anti-viral agents was held in Pakistan kidney and liver transplant institute conducted and mentored by Prof. Dr. Muhammad Arif Siddigi, the workshop titled "Breast cancerchallenge of the day "was chaired by Prof Dr Abubakar Shahid in the Institute of nuclear medicine and oncology, Lahore. The basics of laparoscopic surgery workshop was conducted by Prof Tayyab Abbass at Jinnah Hospital, Lahore. Around 250 doctors were registered for these workshops and the overall rating was rated as very effective and useful training sessions by CME board of PIMA. The convention was awarded 12 hours of CME credit.

The inaugural session was addressed by a renowned scholar Prof Dr. Ishtiaq Ahmad Gondal reciting the verses from Holy Quran and explaining the text he read out focusing on "doing good to







everyone as an emblem for the faithful". The welcome address was read by the convention chair Prof Dr. Hafiz Ijaz who thanked the delegates and guest speakers who travelled all the way from all corners of the country and abroad to update their skills, knowledge and acumen during this short span of time. Dr Anis Ahmad presented the them atic lecture on

emphasizing the role of Muslim physicians in accomplishing their daily routines with fear of Allah SWT and service to mankind as the mainstay of their objective. Dr Musa Nordin and Dr Ihsan Karaman delivered their welcome speeches. Dr Khawaja Sadiq Hussain, former President of CPSP and ex-principal of King Edward medical College, Lahore was the guest of honor for the inaugural session. He was of the opinion that without emphasizing the need for the practice of morality







and ethics, the secular and nonspiritual medicine is turning into an ugly trade and ends up in mere business, which the higher human values fails to endorse. He advised the young graduates to practice humility and humanity with spirit of empathy and follow footsteps of great Muslim physicians like Avicenna and Al Zawahari.

The second session was chaired by Dr Khawaja Sadiq Husain where Dr Saeed Akhtar, chairman of PKLI, Lahore in a very impressive way appraised the alarming magnitude of ever-growing morbidity and mortality related to HCC with Hepatitis C and B as causative agents. He said that Pakistan was amongst top five countries harboring the alarming viral burden and resultant progressive and delayed cancer transformation. He also showed statistics of backlog of transplant urgently required for liver cirrhosis and end stage renal disease cases piling up enormously







due to shortage of such facilities in the country. He was confident that ever increasing number of patients requiring renal transplant and threats arising from illegal trafficking of human organs and transplantation will come to an end soon.

The third session was dedicated to Medical Relief, Dr Hafeez ur Rehman, Ex-President of PIMA gave a thematic presentation on importance of humanitarian and medical relief as the service to mankind and its key role in achieving success in this world and hereafter. Dr Musa Nordin gave a detailed account of Rohingya crisis and role of IMAs and FIMA in combating this challenge. He highlighted the concerted efforts made in the area of medical relief for Rohingya refugees in Cox's bazar under FIMA and IMARET, NDF, PIMA, IMASA, IMANA and other IMAs partner organizations. He was of the opinion to declare a







medical emergency and all the IMAs be urged to play a pro-active role to fight this global tragedy and worst genocide of modern times. Dr. Tanveer Zubairi past President of FIMA highlighted the Syrian crises and dire need of medical relief for the Syrian refugees and war struck destitute. He said that the Syrian crises has taken a toll of hundreds of thousands of human lives and incapacitated an equal number of people during the civil war in the last decade. He advocated a political and tangible lasting solution to the issue otherwise global peace cannot be guaranteed and it may ignite chain of serious consequences. Mr. Abdul Ghaffar an Islamic scholar emphasized the necessity of Muslim unity and need of propagation of message of peace in all the disaster and civil war struck areas. Report of PIMA relief was presented by Dr Shmashad Ali, Secretary of the flagship program of POB-Prevention of blindness trust (a subsidiary of PIMA). PIMA is





one of the major player in the areas of medical and humanitarian relief since long and IS devoted to the cause of alleviating the pain and misery of impoverished communities and envisage to seek pleasures of Allah SWT by serving mankind.

PIMA is Engaging the medical youth mainly comprising of medical students, young graduates and residents into PIMA working especially in the areas of character building, practice of ethics and volunteerism for a noble cause. A dedicated training session related to the youth was held and a talk by Peace TV scholar Molana Khalil ur Rehman highlighting the life of Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) as a leader of youth quoting practical lessons of wisdom from the secrat of the Hoy Prophet(PBUH). Another excellent narration came from Zubair Manoosri, a scholar dealing in motivation & advocacy for







character building, in light of life, death and waking up from sleep of Ashab e Kahaf.

There were four parallel scientific session in the evening on contemporary medical issues and topics of general interest in continued medical education session. The speakers (both national and international) inspired the delegates with current and evidence based medical practice and innovations recently introduced.

On day 2, the first session was on "Ethics and medical profession" with Prof Najib ul Haq as the keynote speaker on "role of faith in










medical practice" emphasizing the high standards of humanity coupled with principles of divinity to be an ideal for Muslim physicians. The legendary figure in faith based circles in Pakistan and highly ranked scholar "Molana Tariq Jamil" attracted the maximum number of audience as he spoke of life of Muhammad (PBUH) as a role model. He gave practical tips to follow Sunnah and to lead a happy and a blissful life. The next session was on health issues and challenges in Pakistan chaired by Federal health minister of Pakistan Mrs Saira Afzal Tarrar. Prof Igbal Khan, Prof Syed Muhammad Awais and Dr Wasay Shakir highlighted the

















IMASA Hosts 38th Annual Convention

The 38th Annual convention of the Islamic Medical Association was held at the Wanderers Club in Johannesburg from 27-28 April. The main guest speakers were Sheikh Nuruddeen Lemu and his wife Sister Salatu Lemu who is the director of research and training of the Dawah Institute of Nigeria. He is the son of the famous Sheikh Ahmed and Ayesha Lemu.

Both speakers made a huge impact on the conference delegates and in particular Sheikh Lemu raised many issues concerning our understanding of the Usul al Fiqh and the Shariah and its implementation in the context of our times. One of the key issues he raised was that in order for us to have clear rulings on many of the issues that confront us today, particularly in the field of medicine, we need scholars who are well versed in all the classical schools of thoughts, not just the famous four. In addition, just as we have subspecialisation in the field of medicine, we also need scholars who have sub-specialisation in the Islamic sciences. Just as a general medical practitioner cannot treat every ailment and has to refer to other specialist, an ordinary graduate of a Darul uloom is not qualified to issue rulings on any and every issue. We require scholars specialising in such fields as usul ul Figh, magasid as shariah, finance, medicine, tasawwuf, etc.


The research papers that were presented at the conference covered a very large wide range of topics from diabetes, psychology, taking care of the elderly, allied health, dental health, etc. A very encouraging feature of the conference was the number of highly qualified Muslim women doctors and professors present and who presented papers and contributed to the discourse. There were parallel programmes for the youth, university students and spouses.

At the gala dinner on Saturday evening Mufti Ismail Menk and Wadah Khunfur (exdirector of Al Jazeera) and currently director of the Sharq Forum spoke on the theme: **Islam - Present and future**. Both speakers emphasised that Islam is the Deen of Allah and He is the one who will see it continue till the end of time. As Muslims all we have to do is to follow His commands and do our utmost to establish His order on earth.
