And in April 2009, the American College of Physicians honoured FIMA with the Linda Rosenthal award for this humanitarian achievement. The FSV is one among our other medical & humanitarian relief projects under FIMA Relief. FIMA is also actively involved in student activities. We only just concluded our 11<sup>th</sup> International Summer Camp for Medical Students in Langkawi Island in Malaysia, and had over 6<sup>th</sup> Umrah & Ziarah program for students in April 2009.

## FIMA - SIMA Convention Khartoum, Sudan / Concluding address of Dr. Musa Nordin, Ex-President FIMA

Sudan was one amongst the 10 founder nations of FIMA in Florida, USA. And Sudan assumed the role as the first chairman of the FIMA Council. Since then, two FIMA Conferences have been organised in Khartoum, in 1983 and 1990. More recently, there has been a flurry of relief activities in Sudan, demonstrating the close collaboration amongst FIMA, SIMA, the Ministry of Health Sudan & other international agencies.

Darfur, Sudan was the epicenter of our FIMA Save Vision (FSV) program which began in April 2005. The FSV was a public health program dedicated to the prevention of blindness;

The establishment of sustainable eye care facilities and training of local eye surgeons and paramedics also took place through this program. Since then, FIMA has rolled out FIMA Save Vision in 7 other countries in Africa (Chad, Senegal, Nigeria, Mali, Somalia, Niger, Kenya)

and 3 countries in Asia (Pakistan, Indonesia, Sri Lanka). Around 500,000 patients were examined and about 42,000 cataract surgeries were performed. There was a total of 244 eye camps and 629 visits by eye surgeons. This project has catapulted FIMA into the "Whos Who" of international humanitarian & relief work.

Our CIMCO (Consortium for Islamic Medical Colleges) had their workshop in Kuala Lumpur in May 2009 and the IHC (Islamic Hospital Consortium) had their workshop in Indonesia in April 2009. We continue to document our scholarship in our Annual FIMA Year Book. The 2008 issue addresses "Women's Issues: An Islamic Perspective".

All this was made possible through the close collaboration between the 23 full member IMAs, our 9 associate members along-with 11 other



IMAs with observer status and various national & international agencies. We were all delighted to be in Khartoum again in August 2009, for our 4<sup>th</sup> International Conference organized by SIMA and our 26<sup>th</sup> FIMA Council Meeting. The theme of our conference “HEALTH PROBLEMS IN RELATION TO DISPLACEMENT & DISASTERS” was most appropriate and timely to address the various burgeoning issues of displaced



populations as a consequence of natural or man-made disasters. We hope the various scientific paper presentations and deliberations at the convention would be published as a proceeding in our FIMA Year Book for the benefit of a wider audience. Our annual Council meeting is another occasion for us to celebrate some of our achievements which simultaneously endow further confidence to climb greater heights. It is also a period of reflection of our organizational operations & infrastructure, examining our strengths and weaknesses. And our perennial contemplation to search inwardly how much as individuals and an organization we have Endeavored to beseech the Pleasure of Allah through refinements of our human character and service towards mankind.

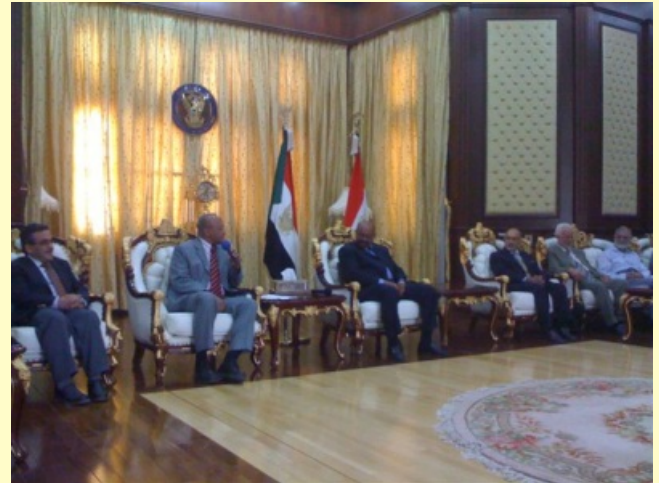

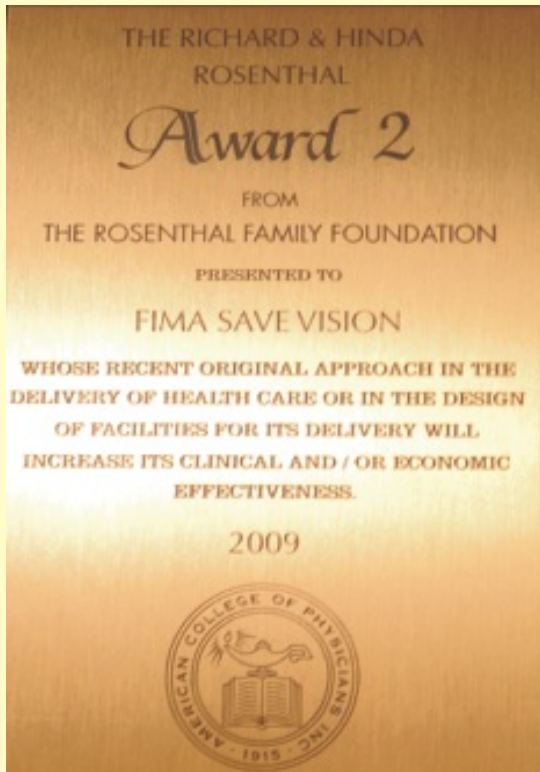
