Message From the President



President FIMA attended a special 'Informal Interactive Hearings of the UN General Assembly with NGO's, civil society organizations and

private sector', in New York on June 14-15, 2010. In order to provide input to the preparatory process for the 'MGD summit', a high-level plenary meeting on 20-22 September 2010, the UN General Assembly, in resolution A/RES/64/184 asked the President of its 64th session, H.E. Dr. Ali Abdussalam Treki, to convene this informal hearings. The outcome of the hearings (a summary by the President of General Assembly) will thus constitute a formal input into the political process leading to summit itself. FIMA attended the meeting as an NGO observer. The themes of the four sessions were as follows:

- 1- Building a better tomorrow: local actions, national strategies and global structures.
- 2- Equal and inclusive partnerships: Accountability in the fight against poverty.
- 3- Sustaining development and withstanding crises.
- 4- From voice to policy: 1660 days left.

CIMCO annual meeting was held in Samarinda East Kalimantan Indonesia from 4-6 June 2010.Medical educationists attended the meeting from Pakistan, Malaysia, Indonesia, Yemen, Egypt, Jordan, and Saudi Arabia. More than 15 Deans or vice deans of different universities participated in this meeting while distinguish professors and medical teachers took active part in the proceedings of the two days workshop on Medical education an Islamic perspective. The long term aim is to bench mark criteria for an Islamic Medical Curriculum and peer accreditation among CIMCO affiliates first and other interested parties later. The participants presented 16 very valuable papers with elaborated discussion and active participation. The major issues covered were research (basic and clinical), Professionalism, Methodologies of inculcating Islamic input at different spirals and modules of curriculum, Tools of modification, ways and means to change from traditional teaching strategies to integrated strategies, how to make and implement changes, What changes are required

and how to implement changed curriculum, How to design and implement ethical module, ethics of educational process,

preventive measures for dichotomies, Student's evaluation, program evaluation and Quality control and accreditation in medical education. At the end of the meeting. a round table discussion was held will representatives from all present (most represented by the Deans themselves) and the text of an was agreed upon MOU and signed. This will facilitate formal exchanges of staff, students, R&D and curriculum. The plan for next year was charted with time bounded targets and at the end all the members present in this meeting signed MoU for further cooperation at various levels among all member institutions. By signing this MoU further cooperation will be sorted at students, faculty and institutional level. It was also decided that a generic model of medical education will be formulated for the use of all members and minimum bindings will be essential to retain the membership of CIMCO. It was also decided that CIMCO will hold a full

day workshop during FIMA council meeting to be held on 19th to 29th September 2010 at Beirut. Where more elaborated work will be done ion issues discussed in current issue. Dr AlyMeshal informed that FIMA year Book 2010 already in press and comprising seven articles from CIMCO and will be soon available as hard and soft copies. It was also realized that much work has been done by different institutions and needs to be relooked and should be available for member institutions. Some institutions need support from the others and it was also decided that all such assistance may kindly be encouraged and signing MoU is a step forward to this cooperation. The secretariat was asked to be more proactive in coordination and streamlining various issues. The executive Director FIMA emphasized that CIMCO should be our priority and we must come up with fresh ideas as well as consolidate our cooperation among the member institutions. One should not be in much hurry in obtaining immediate results of CIMCO performance rather patient, persistent, pursuant and prudent efforts are required to achieve the targets. It was also decided that a three days CIMCO symposium will be held in April 2011 at Islamabad.



FIMA delegates inaugurates Relief Project in Sumatra, Indonesia

Following participation in IHC and CIMCO seminars in Samarinda-Kilantan in the far east of Indonesia on June 4-6,2010, the FIMA delegates followed arrangements made by Prof. Jurnalis Uddin. President of YARSI, to attend the ground breaking of the FIMAsupported relief project in the earthquake destroyed village Lambeh, district of Pariaman in Sumatra in the far west of Indonesia. The small FIMA group included Dr. Aly Mishal, Dr. Abdel Karim Abu Samaha-Director of hospital at JUST University in Yemen & Prof. Jurnalis

From the airport, a YARSI car took this delegation to the village, where they were touched by the warm reception of the villagers. Most men, women and children formed a large reception crowd with their local traditional dresses, religious songs with drums of local tradition... all amidst destruct left by the earthquake.

The ceremony included Qur'an recitation, religious songs and speeches by local representatives of villagers. Prof. Aly and Prof. Jurnalis Uddin made short speeches at the site of the construction project. Then they toured the construction area,



and participated in the ceremonial placement of stone and cement in the ground breaking.

The group lunch was served on the ground of the area of the earthquake destroyed Masjid.

The group was highly moved and touched by this group of villagers, in a remote, poor, destroyed district of Sumatra, Indonesia as the global support by FIMA relief and the local Indonesian generosity made this dream come true.

NATIONAL BREAST FEEDING AWARENESS WEEK: 21-27 June 2010

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In the Name of ALLAH (GOD), the Most Compassionate, the most merciful and the mothers giving birth to their children should breastfeed them up to two years, if they want to complete the lactation period." (al qur'an: Chapter 2, verse 233) More than fourteen hundred



years ago, before any medical knowledge on health values and the benefits of breastfeeding was available, Islam recommended every mother to BREASTFEED her children up to the age of two years if the lactation period was to be completed.

Similarly, the final prophet Muhammad(peace be upon him) demanded that every mother BREASTFEED her child when he said:

"BREASTFEED your child even from the water of your eyes!". Evidence suggests that different prophets and the last prophet Muhammad(peace be upon them), were all breastfed. It is such a noble Divinly - inspired act to do that Islam allows a mother to be paid financially for breastfeeding if she so wishes!

However every Muslim mother will be paid by ALLAH as the prophet Muhammad(peace be upon him) has said: "...for every mouthful and for every suck,(the woman) receives the reward of one good deed..!" Today, as the slogan BREAST IS BEST is displayed in every clinic, we know that there are an increasing number of scientific and medical studies proving the great health and psychological benefits for both: mother and baby in breastfeeding.

Conversely, we are increasingly aware of the harm, damage and susceptibility to diseases affecting children who are bottle-fed: skin and allergic diseases, diarrhea, colic, gastro-intestinal diseases,

obesity, kidney damage, lower IQ, cot death etc... It is also known that breastfeeding prevents the death of six million infants annually by giving them: greater resistance against infections and diseases, especially because of COLOSTRUM,in the first few days of breastfeeding, as it is highly nutritious and full of antibodies(giving the child:strong and permanent immunity against diseases: BEST IMMUNISATION..!). Breastfeeding is important for the psychological health of children helping them to grow up stable, mature, loving caring, and intelligent. It is essential for BONDING between mother and child and through skin-to-skin contact! Breastfeeding is very beneficial to the mother too for the followings: Lower chance of breast and ovarian cancer, less chance of obesity and osteoporosis, and it helps to bring back the womb to its natural size after childbirth. Latest medical reports and studies prooved new benefits from Breastfeeding: Halving the death of children from sudden infant death syndrome(SIDS)Reducing HIV infections in the babies Reducing the risk of breast cancer, heart disease, stroke and Diabetes.. And the World Health Organisation(WHO) has replaced lately the standard child growth rate which was based on bottle fed babies, to a new

child growth rate which is based on breastfeeding as it is more accurate! Proper and full breastfeeding is one way of NATURAL FAMILY PLANNING if needed, and is ideal for spacing children(LACTATION AMENORRHEA/LAM). Breastfeeding is a HUMAN RIGHT for every woman! Breastfeeding is very ECONOMICAL and saves us a lot of money! UNICEF in Dhaka reported in 1996 that: Mother's milk can save

Bangladesh \$500 million per year! Breast milk is a natural wholesome pure healthy diet with the right formula and constituents to the child..it is convenient, easy and at the right temperature! It is safe, easy to digest and is free! It is great for the environment and to save waste! If, for some reasons, the natural mother can not give her own milk, Islam recommends that a "wet nurse" (another lactating woman) to breastfeeds her baby..but precaution should be made to avoid the marriage between the children of both women/mothers later.

ALL MUSLIM WOMEN SHOULD BREASTFEED THEIR CHILDREN AND OBEY ALLAH AND THE FINAL PROPHET MUHAMMAD, FOR THE HEALTH BENEFITS FOR BOTH HERSELF AND HER CHILD IN THIS LIFE ANDFOR THE HIGH REWARDS IN THE LIFE AFTER! decade of major UN conferences and summits, world leaders came together at UN Headquarters in New York to adopt the UN Millennium Declaration, committing their nations to a new global partnership to reduce extreme poverty and setting out a series of time-bound targets - with a deadline of 2015 - that have become known as the Millennium Development Goals. The eight Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) which range from halving extreme poverty to halting the spread of HIV/AIDS and providing universal primary education, all by the target date of 2015 form a blueprint agreed to by all the world's countries and the entire world's leading development institutions. They have galvanized unprecedented efforts to meet the needs of the worlds poorest.

"Eradicating extreme poverty continues to be one of the main challenges of our time, and is a major concern of the international community. Ending this scourge will require the combined efforts of all, governments, civil society organizations and the private sector, in the context of a stronger and more effective global partnership for development. The Millennium Development Goals set timebound targets, by which progress in reducing income poverty, hunger, disease, lack of adequate shelter and exclusion while promoting gender equality, health, education and environmental sustainability can be measured. They also embody basic human rights the rights of each person on the planet to health, education, shelter and security. The Goals are ambitious but feasible and, together with the comprehensive United Nations development agenda, set the course for the world's efforts to alleviate extreme poverty by 2015."
