

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



Ramadhan Kareem to all of you. Fasting in Ramadan develops in a person the real spirit of social belonging, of unity and brotherhood, and of equality before Allah SWT. This spirit is the natural product of the fact that when people fast they feel that they are joining the whole Muslim Ummah in observing the same duty, in the same manner, at the same time, for the same motives, and for the same end. Fasting is an institution for the improvement of moral and spiritual character of human being. The purpose of the fast is to help develop selfrestraint, self-purification, Godconsciousness, compassion, the spirit of caring and sharing, the love of humanity and the love of Allah SWT. Fasting trains us in patience, unselfishness, and gratitude. When we fast we feel the pains of deprivation and hunger, and learn how to endure it patiently. The meaning of this powerful experience in a social and humanitarian context is that

President Abdullah Gül received the Chairman of the Turkey branch of DWW (Worldwide Doctors), Prof. Dr. M. İhsan Karaman and his accompanying delegation at the Çankaya Presidential Palace.

Expressing his happiness to have seen the aid that the Turkish people had made, President Gül declared that this indicated how generous they were. "That the Turks protect people everywhere without segregating them," said the President. He later vowed that he would do whatever necessary to help the DWW to carry out their voluntary work in the whole world.

Prof. Dr. Karaman informed the President that they have organizations

in 24 different countries that have examined 2 million people so far. He further briefed the President that they had performed surgical operations on 2000 patients half of whom suffered from cataracts and that 150,000 people had been circumsized by the Turkish branch of DWW.

Established in April 2000, Doctors Worldwide (DWW) aims to provide medical relief and aid to people who are in need without any access or means to basic medical care regardless of their race, religion, ethnicity or nationality. In 2004 Doctors Worldwide-Turkey

branch was established in Istanbul. DWW consists of nearly 1300 voluntary health staff 300 of whom are from Turkey.









PIMA Quit-Smoking Drive During Ramadhan 2013

Smoker needs commitment and courage to abandon a bad habit

Pakistan Islamic Medical Association (PIMA) during this Ramadhan launched its National Ouit Smoking Day and campaign with the motive to sensitize people, particularly smokers about their responsibility towards protection of their health as well as those around them. PIMA President Dr. Misbahul Aziz on the occasion said a smoker needs commitment and courage to abandon a bad habit while the holy month of Ramadhan provides best opportunity to gain control over ones' self, which is one of the objective of fasting.

Prof. Javaid A Khan a senior chest physician and coordinator for NATC-Pakistan, said concerted efforts are required at every level for the betterment of public health. He mentioned that tobacco consumption, particularly smoking, is the single most common factor responsible for 50% chest infection induced deaths in the country. The expert also urged the government to ensure proper implementation of laws adopted by the parliamentarians to protect people against active as well as passive impact of smoking and tobacco consumption.

Meanwhile, PIMA has made elaborate arrangements to hold public awareness seminars and lectures at hospitals throughout the country with health professionals, medical associations and clerics to share the importance of the occasion with the masses. Religious scholars have already announced their support for PIMA's No Tobacco Day.


















BIMA (British Islamic Medical Association) formally founded and launched






