




MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

The target year for achieving all MDGs has been set for 2015, with 1990 being the baseline. The Muslim countries have committed to achieving the above MDGs.

SaveSmile of 25 volunteer physicians and medical students arrived at Khartoum Airport on March 2, 2014 for its 5th Annual Cleft Lip Surgical Mission.

After a brief 90 minute rest the team proceeded straight to the hospital at 8am where the surgical team worked for the next 5 days providing free cleft lip and palate reconstructions to those in need.

As the IMR-FIMA team arrived at the hospital they were greeted by



families and children eagerly waiting for their arrival. Many traveled long distances in hope to seek definitive treatment for their deformities. FIMA's pat President Dr. Parvaiz Malik and IMANA President Dr. Ismail Mehr spoke on behalf of FIMA and IMANA respectively thanking the local hosts and focusing on the significance of this year being the 5th annual mission trip to Sudan.

The team focused on setting up and coordinating logistics for the

patient flow and procedural process. Five operating stations were quickly established. At 12:30 pm the team made it's first incision, changing the lives of a total 23 patients who were operated on our first day. 270 patients were scheduled to be seen

within the next five days.

Till final day a total of 644 patients were operated. On the concluding day the team was honored with a lovely going away banquet. The hosts from the Sudanese Islamic Medical

Association (SIMA) were nothing short of spectacular the entire week. In the closing remarks each and every one of IMR members had a chance to say a few words. Appreciating the SIMA efforts to make this marathon activity a great success.

FIMA SAVE-VISION CONDUCTS FREE EYE CAMPS IN NIGERIA - JANUARY 2014

After completion of two free eye camps in Gombe and Kaduna States of Nigeria in December 2013, where 1247 free eye surgeries were performed, FIMA Save Vision held two other free eye camps in Bauchi & Kaduna States in January 2014, where 1007 free eye surgeries with implantation of intraocular lens were performed.

Bauchi Free Eye Camp:

Bauchi 2014 Eye Camp took place at Bayara General Hospital at Bayara, Bauchi. The Eye Camp was commenced on 15th January with a huge turn out of the patients paralleled by an impressive number of Ophthalmic doctors, nurses, support staff etc. It was a camp sponsored by I Care Women and Youth Initiative and fully supported by IMAN. I-Care Women and Youth Initiative (ICWYI) is an NGO founded by Dr. Hajiya Amina Namadi Sambo, the wife of the Vice President Federal Republic of Nigeria. We had over 600 patients who benefited from the screening and

got other treatment other than cataract operation. A total of 527 patients had successful Cataract operation during this period.

On the 18th January, a ceremony was organised for the purpose of flagging off and advocacy for the Eye Camp. The occasion was attended by the representative of the Executive Governor of Bauchi State, the Speaker of Bauchi State Assembly, Mallam Yahaya Mohammed Miya. The Founder of I-Care Women and Youth Initiative,

Kaduna Free Eye Camp:

Kaduna free eye camp was conducted from 20th to 24th January 2014 at Yousaf Hospital Kaduna Nigeria. Partner organizations apart from FIMA Save Vision were IIRO (International Islamic Relief Organization), IMAN (Islamic Medical Association Nigeria) & Haja Fatima Mai Boro. Some 480 patients were operated for cataract with Intraocular lens Implantation. National

coordinator FIMA Save Vision Nigeria Dr. Imam Wada Bello and Patron FIMA Save Vision in Nigeria Engr. Ibrahim Abdullah Maimaje supervised the camp.

Director FIMA Save Vision Dr. Intzar Hussain had a meeting with representatives of IMA Nigeria and appreciated their efforts for the perfect arrangements of the eye camps in Bauchi & Kaduna State by FIMA Save Vision.

Another meeting of sponsors & stakeholders of FIMA Save Vision in Nigeria was conducted at kaduna which was attended by Engr. Ibrahim Abdullah Maimaje, Dr. Imam wada bello, Haja Fatima mai boro, Lt col Shehu Ibrahim, Hajia Maryam Yahya Sani and representatives of IMA Nigeria. This meeting was presided by Dr Intzar Hussain. In this meeting strategy for future camps and workshop of corneal transplantation and to train the local eye surgeons in 2014 were decided.

SOMALIA YOUNG DOCTORS ASSOCIATION PROVIDES MEDICAL AND RELIEF SERVICES TO RECENT INFLUX OF REFUGEES

A Three days long SOYDA mobile camp was organized in KM 10-13 IDP Camps in Afgooye corridor Lower Shabelle Region, where a large number of new IDPs had settled since early March 2014. The achievement made during the course of the mobile team were immense. SOYDA attended to 759 beneficiaries in total and most of them were children and mothers who were mostly suffering and starving and could not afford to buy a single tablet of medicine. Before the actual day of commencement SOYDA carried out an environmental screening considering the security, and accessibility as well as the needs of the IDPs.

The three days mobile camp conducted by SOYDA





commenced on 04th April and continuing till 07/04/2014.

SOYDA carried out these activities through spirit to help effort and a concerted team work, as well rapid need response. The methodologies carried were basically quick screening of the beneficiaries doing intensive consultations with diagnosis and providing essential medication.

The main health problems encountered were severe malnutrition, acute watery diarrhea, RTI and Measles mostly the children under 5 age were found to be the victims.

In the above 5 years age group respiratory tract infection, intestinal parasites and anemia







were prevalent.

The adults were also found malnourished and suffering from skin infections, anemia, chronic disease and urinary tract infection and pelvic inflammatory disease, there was no antenatal or postnatal care for expecting mothers.

The three days mobile camp activities carried out by SOYDA was successful and the organization volunteer team consisted of 3 Doctors, 4 Nurses, 2 Pharmacist and 2 lab technician, beneficiaries 278 were children, 369 were mothers (lactating and pregnant) 112 were male including old age people.




















News in Brief



REMAINING MESSAGE OF THE PRESIDENT

achievements in implementing the MDGs is not meeting the expected standards. Muslims form one of the biggest religious groups in the world with an estimated population of over 1.8 billion. Achieving the MDGs holds the promise of saving millions of lives; addressing the scourge of illiteracy, hunger and malnutrition; and ensuring good health to lead productive lives. However achieving Health MDGs 4, 5 and 6 may appear a daunting task to many developing and relatively resource poor Muslim nations.

OIC (Organization of Islamic Cooperation) in the same wake of improving the preventive and curative health standards in the under developed Muslim countries. The 4th Islamic Conference of Health Ministers (ICHM), held in Jakarta on 22-24 October 2013, adopted the OIC Strategic Health Programme of Action (SHPA) 2014-2023. The Health Ministers also adopted a detailed Implementation Plan to facilitate and guide the effective implementation of the SHPA.

The SHPA provides a framework for focused action and international collaboration for the next ten years to deal with the most pressing challenges and needs of the OIC Member States in the field of health. The adoption of the SHPA and its Implementation Plan is expected to impart a new impetus to the OIC health agenda and the programmes and activities of the OIC

and its institutions in this field. FIMA is now a new partner with OIC to jointly work on these health related issues and FIMA has extended its fullest support to OIC in meeting the challenges in SHPA.

Under OIC, Muslim countries are building upon the strength of Islamic traditions selfhelp, solidarity and protection of the people especially the vulnerable. Many of these countries demonstrably require additional resources, hence the flow of developmental assistance needs to be increased, with the wealthier Muslim countries assuming their responsibility towards the poorer nations by providing the necessary funding and technical expertise. Without good intercountry cooperation, achieving the health related MDGs is likely to remain elusive for many Muslim nations. Nevertheless, Muslim nations have reiterated their commitment to give high priority in providing optimum and quality health care to their population at the third Islamic Conference of Health Ministers held in Astana, Republic of Kazakhstan in October 2011 and later in Jakarta in 2013. If we are to meet the MDGs, there is no time to rest, we have to infuse a new sense of urgency to prepare for the final push to achieve the MDGs by 2015 and fulfill the hopes of millions of people in the Muslim nations.
