MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



HIV-AIDS is an ever growing and sensitive global health challenge. A seminar on prevention of HIV-AIDS was held in conjunction with 32nd FIMA council meeting held in Makassar, Indonesia last month in collaboration with FIMA HIV-AIDS resource centre based in Uganda and UNAIDS. The participants were told that UNAIDS and other concerned NGOs point to significant successes of the UNAIDS strategy of Fast-tracking the Response to end the AIDS Epidemic by 2030.

IMA MALAYSIA HOLDS ITS 17th ANNUAL SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE

IMA Malaysia holds its 17th annual scientific conference in commemoration of 25th IMAM silver jubilee from 30th September 2015-2nd October 2015. Theme of the scientific meeting was "Emergency response and disaster preparedness in Penang Malaysia. Speakers from Malaysia and abroad delivered thought provoking and enlightening talks on the issue and thematic lectures in the light of Quran and Sunnah. Main feature of the convention besides the scientific and business meetings was a side program with Dr. Mads Gilbert, the world renowned Norwegian physician and activist, who had served in Gaza four times was attended as the guest of honour.

He urged Malaysia who is now a political power being a member of the United Nations security council and ASEAN chairman to help end the Israeli occupation of Palestine and to capitalise to put concrete pressure

on Israel to immediately lift its siege on Gaza. In another meeting followed by press conference.

Dr Gilbert described the siege of Gaza as "a man-made disaster" that affected 1.8 million people, of which 60% were children and youngsters who still suffer from malnutrition, lack of education and infrastructure after their houses were bombed.

"He later related his experience serving as a medical doctor in Gaza in a two-hour talk to a packed community hall here. Their highness, the ambassadors of Norway and Palestine, and pop singer Mizz Nina were also in attendance.

The keynote Al Zahrawi Memorial Lecture titled 'Overcoming Challenges & Preparing for the Future' at the 17th Islamic Medical Association of Malaysia (IMAM) Annual Scientific Conference was delivered by the DG, Health Dr. Hisham Abdullah, who urged the need to understand and find solutions to the growing social and economic challenges caused by disasters arising from natural hazards & climate change. According to him, the climate scientists claimed that an excessive rainfall is "the new

While disaster prevention should be the greater focus of our efforts; response & preparedness is likewise important to prevent further casualties & reduce losses. Contingency plans are crucial in times of disasters. Communities must draw & test regularly their response plan way ahead of any disaster event and improve constantly on early warning systems & emergency management capacities.





TRANSFORMING OUR WORLD

FIMA deeply concerned over the UN document on "Transforming our world by 2030: a new agenda for global action"

The 32nd FIMA Council was held on August 13-14th in Makassar, Indonesia representing Islamic medical organizations from 40 countries all over the world. After elaborate, careful and meaningful discussion the council and executive committee reviewed the proposed draft of the outcome document for the UN General Assembly Special Session, to be held on September 25-27, 2015, titled: TRANSFORMING OUR WORLD BY 2030: A NEW AGENDA FOR GLOBALACTION.

The draft of the New UN Agenda contains extremely controversial issues, which contradict some of the basic principles of the UN charter that clearly states: "Nothing contained in the present Charter shall authorize the United Nations to intervene in matters which are essentially within the domestic jurisdiction of any state".

The draft of the New Agenda calls for enforcing serious issues, such as sexual and reproductive freedom (regardless of age), which open avenues for adultery, promiscuity, homosexuality, sex work, illegal abortion, emergency contraception, and gender-family structure destructive ideas.

More significantly, this proposed draft, imposes on all states, regardless of their values, religions and legislation, to adopt and implement this new agenda by 2030.

FIMA, therefore declares the following responses towards this proposed new UN Agenda:

- 1. FIMA endorses the statement, issued on July 14, 2015, by the Scholars' Entities and Islamic Organizations on the Zero draft of the outcome document for the UN General Assembly Special Session, to be held on September 25-27, 2015, titled: Transforming our world by 2030: A new agenda for global action.
- 2. FIMA rejects any agendas that contradict the moral, ethical and religious foundation of various states.
- 3. FIMA rejects any new agendas that contradict the basic, recognized principles of the United Nations Charter that calls for respect of the will and jurisdiction of any state.
- 4. FIMA urges all organizations and official authorities in Muslim countries and communities (religious and civil) to voice their opposition to the proposed Agenda, by all possible means, prior to its proposed implementation date of September 25-27, 2015.

FIMA SAVE VISION-POB TRUST HOLDS FREE EYE CAMP IN SHEIKHUPURA, PAKISTAN

POB trust holds an annual free eye camp in collaboration with Al Habib trust hospital, a charitable institution located in the vicinity of Lahore. This year, the three day camp dating from 14th to 16th April, entertained a total of 1940 patients, comprising of 1850 OPD's and 288 surgeries. The cataract surgeries were performed using the technique of Phacoemulsification and IOL implantation. Patients came from all over the country including far off places like Karachi as they are treated free of cost in this hospital, outfitted with latest equipments and state of the art operation theatres. The costs covered in the treatment include that of laboratory tests, surgery as well as medicines.

The camp not only provided free treatment for the patients but also hosted a total no of 220 students on its last day. A small ceremony was conducted at the beginning of the

After giving post-op instructions to the patients the students also gave them gifts, as a gesture of good will and were showered with countless prayers and blessings in return. Free food was also distributed amongst the patients.

It was preceded by a visit to the Sufi Factories where the students learned about the art of making cooking oil. They were given a detailed tour regarding its

REMAINING MESSAGE OF THE PRESIDENT

Unfortunately there is a significant increases in new HIV infections in many Muslim countries, including the Middle East, North Africa, Indonesia and Bangladesh, in which HIV/AIDS prevalence is traditionally much lower than other parts of the world. The notions from contemporary prevailing social and lifestyle changes in Muslim countries point to expectations of possible increased HIV transmission.

Truly speaking, in the Islamic paradigm, HIV/AIDS is not considered as just a virus-induced disease, but rather a manifestation of a serious breakdown of socio-moral and behavioral norms afflicting human societies in varying degrees. The scientific evidence, revealed at the FIMA HIV/AIDS Resource Center, hosted by the Islamic Medical Association of Uganda, showed that high levels of religiosity manifested by high levels of practice of the five pillars of Islam were significantly associated with lower HIV infection rates among Muslim youth. FIMA HIV-AIDS prevention project headed by Dr Abdul Hamid Qudeh has done a wonderful job in imparting training to the Muslim youth and community leaders to act as trainers to combat this ever increasing menace in the Muslim so cities. So far more than 15000 representative from youth and community organizations have been trained in more than 25 countries.

FIMA and many concerned workers caution against attitudes of false security from HIV and other STDs susceptibility, which may lead to complacency in adopting sound and sustainable policies and activities towards public awareness and prophylactic efforts.

FIMA and her IMA affiliates in many world regions have been concerned with the increasing trends of

HIV transmission and disease in Muslim communities. Over the past several years, FIMA launched diligent prophylactic activities based on raising public awareness, and widespread training of local dedicated community leaders, especially among the youth, in collaboration with governmental, civil, social, religious and educational entities.

FIMA training and public awareness activities utilized the latest scientific advances and epidemiologic knowledge, side by side with Islamic teachings and guidance that advocate values of self discipline, chastity, morality, decency, family centricity, and reject the expanding trends of promiscuity, homosexuality, commercial sex, drug abuse and other behaviors, that will always undermine global efforts to effectively combat the HIV/AIDS pandemic.

FIMA welcomes sound collaboration and partnerships with UNAIDS and other stakeholders including governments, multilateral organizations, non-governmental organizations, scientists and academia, women organizations, youth organizations, Muslim scholars as well as Imams and Sheikhs, to fast-track the response to end the HIV/AIDS pandemic.

FIMA will specifically contribute the Islamic approach to the UNAIDS strategy of Fast-tracking the Response to end the HIV/AIDS pandemic.

FIMA calls upon UNAIDS to include the constructive roles of Islamic values and paradigm in the long struggle aiming at an AIDS free world for the whole of humanity.
