MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



The plight and tragedy of more than four million stranded Muslim civilians in Syria continues. In a recent attack at least 72 people have been killed (including 20 children) in northern Syria after being exposed to a toxic gas that survivors said was dropped from warplanes, an attack that sparked comparisons to the most infamous act of the country's six-year war. At least another 100 people were being treated in hospitals in Idlib province where the strike took place at dawn on Tuesday. Several dozen others were transferred to Turkey, some in critical condition.

BRITISH IMA (BIMA) HOLD ITS NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON MARCH 18-19TH IN LONDON

A very well attended and representative conference of Muslim medics working in the United Kingdom was held on March 18-19th in the prestigious King's College, London. The objective was to inspire Muslim healthcare professionals to unite in the service of each other and the public and to aim for ihsan in their careers and faith.

The theme of the conference was #WHATSYOURLEGACY. The meeting started on March 18th 2017 with the recitation of Holy Quran.

Faisal Alam, the chair of BIMA London, welcomed the delegates and said that the conference was aimed at exploring the challenging issues relating

to medical ethics and professional development, and that he hope that such a healthy activity will inspire the participants to aspire for excellence in their careers. The first session was dedicated to the panel discussion on "Ethic, Medicine and Faith". The speakers navigated the maze of ethical challenges of the temporal extremes of life. IMARET-MALAYSIA SENDS OUTREACH PROGRAM TEAMS IN THE REMOTE AREAS OF JOHOR

IMARET & FIMA medical outreach program was conducted for Orang Asli from 17-19 March 2017.

At Kg Lubuk Muman, PosSenderut, Pahang. The following IMARET & FIMA Medical clinics were conducted in Kg Lubuk (91 patients, Kg Bukit Long (130 patients), Kg Sawih (50 patients) and Kg Tigol (30 patients). A dental clinic by Islamic Dental Association Malaysia IDAM, where 64 patients were screened, filling was done for 11 patients and scaling was done on 31 patients. Professor Muhammad Azhar Ali Khan: Dedication to FIMA Is Key to Association's Accomplishments

Professor Muhammad Azhar Ali Khan served FIMA (Federation of Islamic Medical Associations) with passion and dedication since its inception in 1981. He held the following positions while on the executive committee:

- 1983: secretary-treasurer
- 1985: reelected to secretary-treasurer
- 1987-1995: executive member
- 1997: president
- 1999: reelected president
- 2001-2007: executive director

Professor Khan either established or initiated the following projects, now central to the function of FIMA:

- FIMA Accreditation Council for Certification of Continuing Medical Education (ACCCME), which was established to enrich, organize, and standardize continuing medical education programs of various Islamic medical associations and hospitals to ensure that the conventions and scientific meetings of these associations meet a minimum standard as forums for high-quality education.
- FIMA Health Policy, which coordinates the principles and policies of health practices in countries where there are IMA memberships.
- FIMA Special Consultation Status on the United Nations Committee of Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)/Department of Economic and Social Affairs.
- FIMA Consortium of Islamic Medical Colleges (CIMCO), which has goals and objectives as follow:
 - Incorporating Islam into the existing medical education system in member institutions to prepare Muslim health professionals; and
 - Promoting health-related research to serve humanity in the light of Qur'an and Sunnah;

and

 Fostering collaboration in the field of Islamic medical education, training, and health service.

Professor Khan's work was exemplary and served as an inspiration to all. He demanded service and excellence and encourged those he encountered to meet these objectives.

He continuously emphasized the value of effective communication, which is critical to the successful functioning of an organization, as is evident by him simply acknowledging receipt of an email. He recognized the value of cyber communication and especially the effective use of the FIMA website as a communication tool to facilitate discussion between the members and distribute critical information about the FIMA projects and other functions of the association.

He served as a mentor and role model to many of us in FIMA with his quiet, unassuming manner, yet large presence.

I leave you with his final words before his departure to Madinah and Makkah exemplifying the man's humility:

I will pray in haram (the sanctuary in Makkah) and (give) thanks to Allah, the things we did together for the benefit of mankind. Our mission will continue and we will continue to seek His Rahma.

REMAINING MESSAGE OF THE PRESIDENT

Hours after the attack, a hospital treating the injured was also hit. Images taken inside the clinic appeared to depict the blast as it happened. Photographs and videos taken at the scene and in evacuation areas nearby showed rows of small, lifeless children, some with foam visible near their mouths. Millions of Muslims in Syria had been compelled to leave their homes. As innocent civilians continue to be slaughtered within the besieged northern Syria and other previously safer hideouts for the civilians opposed to the tyrant regime of Assad. The recent Sarin gas attacks have refocused attention on the failure of the international community to prevent the worst abuses in Syria's war

Basharul Assad's regime is playing all the dirty tricks to hold power of the region. Critics of the stance have said that the absence of a credible threat has given the regime license to commit war crimes with impunity as its backerssteadily claw back years of battlefield losses.

The greatest present-day humanitarian catastrophe can be largely attributed to the fact that the Muslim world has failed the people of Syria. Even though many nations and organizations (especially the United States and the United Nations through inaction, and Russia through direct aggression) rightfully bear the majority of collective blame for their woeful treatment of Syria, it is important to acknowledge that 1.7 billion Muslims have also let the people of Syria down in several ways.

And yet, despite the reckless destruction of so many Muslim lives, the divided Muslim world is using Syria as the latest staging ground in their proxy war for regional power. The fight is about political power without much of a religious base.

Meanwhile, international Muslim organizations like the Arab League and Organization for Islamic Cooperation have also completely failed in mobilizing 57 Muslim-majority nations in adequately addressing the humanitarian crisis in Syria.

"As a Muslim Physician, I am shocked and appalled at

the complete abandonment by the Muslim world of the plight of their brothers and sisters in Syria," This was the reaction of a young Muslim British doctor. "We always see massive protests [in the Muslim world] if an offensive cartoon is drawn against our prophet. ... But we have seen silence as genocidal massacres take place against Muslim women and children in Syria."

Keeping aside the political scenario, FIMA and its members and partners have been actively engaged in provision of humanitarian and medical relief mainly operating in Lebanon, Jordan and Turkey. IMANA and PIMA recently sent a delegation of doctors and medical camps are conducted periodically. DWW is





the major partner through which IMAs are operating. But still there is a lot of need to generate funds and medical help for the marginalized Syrian refugees and civilians.

All the IMAs are urged to form local Save Syria committees and evaluate their capacity to plan a strategy for helping the destitute.
