


introduced IMANA's new mission statement: "IMANA will strive toward a world in which the wellness and healthcare of all people are served by the North American Muslim community."



#### **Highlights**

- 507,000 new arrivals are reported as of 30 September, including 453,300 new arrivals identified in IOM Needs and Population Monitoring assessments in four upazilas of Cox's Bazar district; 35,000 in refugee camps reported by UNHCR and 18,700 reported by field staff in Naikhongchhari (Bandarbhan district).
- Over the last two days, movement across the border in Cox's Bazar has reportedly decreased again. 37% of refugees arrived by walking and 34% by boat (IOM NPM, 09/2017). People who have arrived since 25 August continue to move to the new Kutupalong Expansion site, where they are constructing new shelters.
- The RRRC is leading on the Kutupalong Expansion project along with the Site Management Taskforce, which includes UNHCR, IOM and other key implementing agencies. 20 'blocks' have been identified by RRRC.
- Agencies continue to focus on delivering aid wherever people have settled.
- Road access continues to be a constraint for humanitarian assistance delivery, with road repairs underway. As of today 630 meters of road construction has been completed in Balukhali.
- Delays (of 5-6 days) in customs and tax exemption certificates have been reported by partners. Coordination is ongoing with MoDMR on setting up a One-Stop-Shop in order to streamline the process (Logistics cluster, 09/2017).

## SOMALIA YOUNG DOCTORS ASSOCIATION (SOYDA) CONDUCTS OUTREACH AND TRAINING PROGRAMS FOCUSING MOTHER AND CHILD HEALTHCARE IN REMOTE AREAS

Somalia Young Doctors Association (SOYDA) is steadfast in its implementation of health, WASH and nutrition program in Banadir and Lower Shabelle region. SOYDA is currently running a total of 11 health and nutrition fixed and Mobile sites, 8 Mobile outreach Integrated WASH, HEALTH, NUTRITION emergency response teams.

Through the leadership of the Federal Ministry of health and UNICEF, SOYDA was able to facilitate in conducting EPI micro planning training to 119 participants from different remote areas.

With support of SHF, SOYDA was able to facilitate IMAM training to 39 participant across all its program, this was aimed in improving the skills and

knowledge of technical program staff hence successfully deliver the services to the vulnerable population in the target areas.

Through the continuous capacity development and on job training of the technical and project staff the project was able to provided capacity development and training opportunity to project staff through which it has conducted integrated



















management of childhood illness, measles and cholera treatment prevention training to 40 participants across SOYDA ongoing programs hence provided an opportunity for the capacity enhancement to all the target project staff in Banadir and Lower Shabelle region with support of SHF Somalia. Through the facility and outreach program sites SOYDA was able to reach a total of 2769 children under five boys and girls for vitamin A supplementation, however, the program was able to reach more than monthly target hence

indicating better progress for the program indicators achievement

219 safe deliveries were conducted in SOYDA health and Nutrition facilities. This improvement was also attributed closer coordination between the program outreach team as well as community traditional birth attendants in the project areas. In this reporting period a total of 1876 pregnant and lactating mothers have attended antenatal care (ANC 1st visit) in this reporting period and has since completed all the 4 comprehensive

ANC visit. The program has recorded success in all reaching the vulnerable mothers with improved maternal health care services in both facilities and outreach sites program.

Limited sanitation facilities in the target IDPs and host communities in the target district hence poor hygiene and sanitation promotion services needs to be improved and requires the focus of funding agencies and the Government authorities.

























#### AL-MARHUM DR ALI EL-HAWAMDEH (1932 - 2017)

Born in Karak, Jordan in 1932, Dr Hawamdeh graduated from Cairo Medical College, Egypt in 1957. He practised medicine in the Ministry of Health, Jordan, before operating his private clinic. On August 15, 1984, the Board of Directors of the Islamic Hospital in Jordan selected him as the Director General of the Hospital. He performed his duties as General Director until 2002 when he retired at the age of 70.

Under his tenure of 18 years, the Islamic Hospital grew steadily in all dimensions, and became the largest hospital in the private sector, and the first to be accredited for specialty residency training in Jordan.

In 1988, he received a special invitation from the president of the Islamic International Council for Da'awa & Relief (IICDR) to become a member of the first General Assembly of the Council. He was the FIMA representative on IICDR for 10 years.

In 1989, he was elected as a Member of Parliament in Jordan, for 4 years. He conducted this major political task in addition to his responsibilities as Director General of the Islamic Hospital. Dr. Hawamdeh donated all his salaries from Parliament to the Islamic Hospital.

Dr. Hawamdeh was elected as FIMA Secretary and Treasurer during the 4th FIMA Council meeting on January 3 5, 1987 in





Amman, Jordan. Dr. Hawamdeh enhanced the vision and mission of FIMA and directed the capabilities of the Islamic Hospital (IH) for the global FIMA cause.

The secretarial and communication facilities of IH were put at the service of FIMA. He and the IH extended hospitality to delegations from various IMAs, individuals and groups, towards nurturing brotherhood, understanding and collaboration between Muslim medical practitioners and expanding the membership of FIMA.

With the support of the Board of Directors, Dr Hawamdeh directed the financial support of many of FIMA's activities during its early formative years. The Islamic Hospital in Jordan doubled its annual dues to further support FIMA activities.

Under his dynamic leadership, the



IH in Jordan became the epicenter of FIMA activism. Delegations from all over the world, representing IMAs, relief organizations and other Islamic medical, charitable and social groups, were received and hosted by the IH.

Muslim medical students from all over the world, especially those selected by their respective IMAs, came to the IH for their elective training. They were received, housed, trained, and orientated with the Islamic ethos by qualified IH medical and health professionals.

Medical doctors and trainees in various medical fields came to the Islamic Hospital, for their specialty and sub-specialty training and to enhance their knowledge, skills and experiences.

Many Islamic hospitals from various countries sent delegations to the IH to benefit from its experiences in specific areas of hospital administration, operations, management and accreditation which are Shari'ah compliant.

Under his leadership, the IH actively participated in various relief campaigns conducted by FIMA in countries afflicted by disasters.

Dr Hawamdeh served diligently as both FIMA Secretary and Treasurer for 10 years until 1997. He continued his executive position as FIMA treasurer for 18 years until



June 2005 at the FIMA Council meeting in Sana'a, Yemen.

In 2002, at the age of 70, Dr Hawamdeh retired as Director General of the IH, but continued his services as the FIMA treasurer until 3 years later.

Dr Hawamdeh hosted and honored virtually all the FIMA delegations in his home and showered them with his undivided and generous hospitality. He personally received them on arrival, accompanied them on their sight-seeing trips, fed them well and bid them farewell on their return. All this with his warm loving heart, always smiling and joking, which made us all felt at ease and loved him ever so much.

He was like a loving grandfather to the many medical students and trainees, a father and mentor to many of us physicians and specialists and a genuine friend to his peers, the likes of Dr Aly Mishal, Dr Adnan Jaljuli, Dr Mohamed Khan, Dr Ghulam, Dr Jurnalis, Dr Syed Mubin et al.

For his outstanding and unparalleled contributions to the advancement of the ideals of FIMA, he was awarded the FIMA Lifetime Achievement Award in 2007, at the FIMA and Hayat Foundation Gala

Dinner during the 24th FIMA Council Meeting in Istanbul, Turkey. With the background information provided by Syakh Dr Aly Mishal, I as the president of FIMA then, had the honor of reading his remarkable citation during this most prestigious celebration.



## A SEMINAR AND PANEL DISCUSSION ON IMMUNIZATION FROM THE ISLAMIC PERSPECTIVE

A Seminar and Panel Discussion on Immunization from the Islamic Perspective, were held on Saturday, 9th September 2017 in Asy-Syifa mosque of RSCM Hospital in Jakarta. This event was a collaboration of IMANI (Islamic Medical Association and Network of Indonesia) and IKADI (Indonesia Du'at Association) with support from various authorities and Islamic Institution which includes the Ministry of Health, FIMA, MUKISI, FOKI, BSMI, FOZ and BAZNAS.

The event were successfully attended by 119 individuals, religious figure who represents Muslim community and journalists from Islamic media from all over Indonesia, designed to equip them with the correct information on immunization. This is an important effort to curb misinformation and misleading dissemination on immunization from the Islamic perspective. Each participants were given 2 books on immunization for further reading.

4 speakers representing the Ministry of Health, Pediatric

Association, Food and Drug Regulatory Body and the Indonesia Ulama Council, delivered an interactive and informative inputs. The panel discussion went hot when some participants started making negative remarks about immunization. Conclusions from the moderators were able to cool down the situation. The event were closed by a Press Conference to the media. Below are the excerpts of the press release:

IMANI and IKADI together with several Islamic dakwah institution herewith, urges:

- 1. All Muslim to support and participate in the national immunization program, in particular the Measles-Rubella immunization campaign, and to complete the immunization for all their family members.
- 2. In dealing with issues related to immunization; all Muslim, religious scholars and Muslim healthcare professional to adhere to the guidelines provided by the competent

- authorities namely the Indonesian Ministry of Health, Indonesian Pediatric Association, Indonesian Internal Medicine Society, and Islamic Medical Association and Network of Indonesia
- 3. The public needs to be smart in accepting any information, particularly issues related to health and immunization. Please ensure that the information are obtained from competent and credible source.
- 4. Political, religious and community leaders, to support the national immunization program particularly the M e a s l e s R u b e l l a immunization campaign. All effort must be sought to overcome safety, cultural, religious, political resistance through peaceful measures and avoid prolonged disputes in order to provide the rights of immunization to every child in Indonesia.

## COOPERATION PROTOCOL BETWEEN INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF GREEN CRESCENTS & FIMA

A protocol of cooperation was signed between IFGC and FIMA in the 34th Congress on Health in Africa organized by the Federation of Islamic Medical Associations (FIMA), Turkish Ministry of Health, Istanbul Medeniyet University and Hayat Foundation.

The 34<sup>th</sup> Congress on Health in Africa was organized by the Federation of Islamic Medical Associations (FIMA), Turkish Ministry of Health, Istanbul Medeniyet University and Hayat Foundation in Istanbul. 700 international participants, ministers, bureaucrats from over 60 countries participated in the Congress.

In addition to FIMA, representatives of nearly 50 nongovernmental organizations and academicians presented papers. IFGC which brought together 34 National Green Crescents and the Green Crescents to be established cooperated with FIMA. Through the protocol signed between IFGC President Prof. Dr. Ihsan Karaman and FIMA President Dr. Tanveer Zubairi, FIMA and IFGC will cooperate to provide training, content and expert support through co-ordinated work in the field of addictions between IFGC countries and FIMA. Within this framework, it is aimed to announce all kinds of meetings, seminars, training and broadcasting activities to be realized by the two institutions,



to cooperate in research and education activities and to effectively exchange information and experiences. The Congress also included a session dedicated to the Green Crescent's international cooperation and IFGC.

## IFGC targets 60 countries by the end of 2018

The Green Crescent endeavours to be organised at the international level in addition to its branches in Turkey. Within this scope, the Green Crescent gained the status of a global nongovernmental organization by supporting the establishment of National Green Crescents all over the world. With the National Green Crescents, which have been established in 34 countries up to now, the aim is to transfer century-old experience of struggle with addictions to other countries and to support the works on addiction. Having carried its international activities to the next level, the Turkish Green Crescent gathered the National Green Crescents under the roof of the International Federation of Green Crescents (IFGC) which announced its Declaration of Establishment in April 2016. In IFGC, Turkish Green Crescent is a National Green Crescent, like other National Green Crescents, and supervises other countries. The number of the National Green Crescent is currently 34, and the aim is to reach 60 countries by the end of 2018.
