DEADLY STORM SWEPT SOUTH AND SOUTH EAST ASIA, LEAVING AROUND 2000 DEAD AND MILLIONS AFFECTED. IMAS AND FIMA RESPONDS

From Sri Lanka's central highlands to Indonesia's flood-swollen river basins, a wave of climate-fuelled cyclones and monsoon rains has unleashed one of the deadliest weather patterns south and southeast Asia has seen in years, killing more than 2000 people, displacing hundreds of thousands and affecting millions.

Since mid-November, overlapping tropical storms and intensified monsoon systems have triggered catastrophic flooding and landslides across Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Thailand, Malaysia and Viet Nam.

The national and international relief efforts are underway across the region and are supporting government-led emergency operations with food, health, water and sanitation aid, medical deployments and early recovery assessments, as heavy rains continue and fears grow that the crisis could deepen.

Experts say the disasters were driven by an unusual convergence of powerful weather systems, including Cyclones Ditwah and Senyar, alongside a strengthened northeast monsoon.

Warm ocean temperatures and shifting storm tracks have produced extreme rainfall in areas that historically faced lower cyclone risk.

Across the region, nearly 11 million people have been affected, including about 1.2 million forced from their homes into shelters, while roads, utilities and

farmlands have been washed away. The material loss exceeds billions of dollars.

In Indonesia, Banda Aceh, the host of recent FIMA council was one of the worst hit regions with wide scale devastation. IMAs and FIMA in their capacity of extending emergency medical relief were amongst the first responders.

IMAM in Malaysia, IMANI in Indonesia, IMA of Cambodia, IMA of Thailand and Serendib Foundation in Sri Lanka were all busy in provision of medical help

to the destitute.

The recent deadly rains, cyclones, floods and heavy downpour is a result of global warming and atmospheric changes, as warmer ocean waters are increasing the potential for extreme rainfall, while rapid urban growth, deforestation and wetland loss are magnifying flood impacts. Even where early warnings were issued, fast-rising waters overwhelmed evacuation routes in some locations. The future threats are still lurking and a food for thought for the policy makers and Governments.

H.E. Mr. Rawhi Fattouh interacted warmly with the students, appreciating their spirit and Pakistan's continued support for Palestine.




BRITISH MUSLIM HEALTH AWARDS 2025

FLASH FLOODS, LANDSLIDES, AND HYDRO-METEOROLOGICAL DISASTER

A catastrophic combination of Tropical Cyclone Senyar and heavy monsoon rains has triggered massive flash floods and landslides across three provinces: North Sumatra, West Sumatra, and Aceh. Approximately 3.3 million people are affected, with entire villages submerged or buried, and major access roads cut off by debris.

GLIMPSES FROM 7TH KAMMP SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE HELD IN MOMBASA, KENYA



This is an update on our flood relief efforts for our brothers and sisters affected by the recent disaster, carried out by the Thai Islamic Medical Association (TIMA), Thailand.



4th December 2025

This major flood disaster was quite severe, affecting nearly 14 provinces in the southern border region. The hardest-hit area was Hat Yai District, where nearly one million people were affected. Approximately 8,000 tourists, primarily Malaysians, were also stranded; however, all were able to return to their country safely without any fatalities. For Thai citizens, the Ministry of Public Health confirmed 145 deaths (as of 1 December 2025), bringing the total number of fatalities across the southern region to 170.

The Thai Islamic Medical Association (TIMA) carried out the following relief missions:

1. Preparing and distributing meal boxes and operating a central kitchen during the flood.
2. Visiting flooded areas to distribute relief bags to bedridden patients and their families, as well as providing psychological support.
3. The President of the Association was appointed by the Office of the Sheikhul Islam (Chularatchamontri) as a member of the committee responsible for managing the burial of Muslim victims who died in the flood.
