MEET THE NEWLY ELECTED PRESIDENT OF FIMA (FEDERATION OF ISLAMIC MEDICAL ASSOCIATIONS)

Professor Dr. Mohammad Iqbal Khan is a medical graduate, Fellow of Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow (FRCS), and fellow of the Royal College of England (FRCS). In addition to these fellowships, he has earned Master's in Health Professions Education (MHPE) from Maastricht University Netherlands. He was awarded FCPS- vascular Surgery from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Pakistan. He has served on various academic, research and clinical positions at National Health Services (NHS), UK prior to his relocation to Pakistan; where he toiled at various clinical, academic, research and administrative positions including Professor of Surgery, Head of the Department, Vice principal at Riphah International University, Dean Health and Medical Sciences at The University of AJK, Founder Principal of AJK Medical College, Dean Health Sciences Shifa Tameer-e-Millat University (STMU). He was cofounder and remained Chairman of the Consortium of Islamic Medical Colleges (CIMCO) for 8 years. He also remained the founder Director of FIMA Save Dignity program (2007-16). He has been holding key positions in many national and international professional bodies like European Society of Vascular Surgeons and World Association for Bioethics etc.

Currently he is working as **Vice Chancellor** of Shifa Tameer-e-Millat University since 2014. He

is co-founder and **President** of the Society of Vascular surgeons of Pakistan and Chairman of the Board of governors of AEH Jaffer Foundation. He is also member of several National committees on Health and Education. In



addition to academic, research and administrative engagements, he is actively involved in clinical practice as Consultant General and Vascular Surgeon at Shifa International Hospitals. He is also Director Health Professions Education program and program director of Bioethics at STMU, visiting faculty at various Universities in Turkey, Malaysia, Indonesia, UK and Central Asia beside several National universities.

He also serves on the examiners panel of various Universities and Colleges including the Royal College of Surgeons. He has **38 years** of academic and clinical experience, authored **108 research publications and eight books** including books on Medical Ethics and Diabetic Foot to his credit besides several chapters in different books. He has presented over **398 papers**, **facilitated 142 workshops**, national and international and supervised **71 research** theses. His main area of interest is

vascular surgery, professional ethics and innovation in medical curricula at under and postgraduate level. He has been actively involved in designing modular integrated undergraduate curriculum for five years MBBS programs, five years residency program in Surgery, fellowship program of Vascular Surgery and Master Programs for Health Professions Education, which is implemented at various institutions in Pakistan and abroad. He was instrumental in designing and implementing fellowship program in vascular surgery by the college of physicians and surgeons of Pakistan.

He also planned and got registered the Society of Vascular Surgeons of Pakistan. Prof. Khan has been involved in number of volunteer works providing relief to the needy people in natural calamities and manmade disasters both in the country and abroad like 2004 Tsunami in Indonesia, 2005 earthquake and 2009 flood in Pakistan apart from his regular relief works in Pakistan, Sudan, Tanzania, Kosovo, Afghanistan, Bosnia, Palestine, Turkey, Burma, Bangladesh, Malawi, Turkey and other places. He established four field charity hospitals in Pakistan, one each in Kosova, Indonesia, Bosnia and Syria during disasters. His passion is to provide quality healthcare services to those who are not being otherwise taken care of and to provide affordable high quality tertiary education to everyone who strives for that.

The pre-council meeting of FIMA

executive committee was held on 3rd September 2025. FIMA pre council meeting discussed the President's report, executive director's report and treasurer's report and examined the arrangements for 42nd FIMA council meeting, FIMA scientific seminar, CIMCO and IHC Seminars.

42nd FIMA council meeting was held



in the auditorium of BSI (Bank Syariah Islami, Indonesia). The meeting started with recitation of holy Quran followed by the welcome address of local host and dean of USK, Aceh, who greeted the delegates and announced the council meeting and FIMA scientific seminar open. It was followed by a cultural program presented by the local students. 
A resolution was approved for extending moral and monetary support





countries. Save Visio regularly conducting eye camps and training in African countries. Total beneficiaries now exceeds 3,943,787 outpatients and 544,044 surgeries. Now addressing glaucoma surgeries apart from cataract. POB Eye Hospital in Karachi and Lahore performing well.

Project team to submit for King Faisal Award, in category 5: Medicine and Science. More than 40000 surgeries performed between August 2024 to August 2025 FIMA Newsletter Website has been updated with Newsletter. FIMA Newsletter is disseminated through WhatsApp and email by FIMA secretariat

Report of HIV Resource Centre was presented by Dr. Ayub Twaha. The center is providing HIV/AIDS services to communities and Saidina Abubakar Hospital in

Wattuba, promoting increased religiosity for HIV prevention in the



community and monthly data collection and analysis.

Challenges:

- We still have old vehicles. This limited our outreach activities
- Inadequate funding for community activities made worse by closure of USAID
- Inadequate reporting of HIV/AIDS services by IMAs to the FIMA

HIV/AIDS Resource Centre

- Christian based NGO participating in international events

IMA and FIMA can contribute:

- IMAs to send reports of their HIV/AIDS services to the FIMA HIV/AIDS resource centre preferably every six months
- Continue to support the FIMA HIV/AIDS resource centre in fund

raising for vehicles, infrastructure, logistics and human resources.

FIMA Save Dignity report was presented by Dr Salisu, he briefed that USD10,000 grant received from FIMA allocated for Nigeria (USD9,000) and Malawi (USD1,000) with 238 patients benefitted from VVF repair surgery. 21,000+ more benefitted from awareness creation through



roadshows, TV and radio programs, and outreach programs. There is the opportunity for collaboration with FIGO certified doctors in Nigeria to assist with the VVF repairs in Malawi and other African countries. FIMA Save Dignity Project will collaborate

with other NGOs like Medics Across Continents and Philanthropists with similar objectives. Other member IMAs are welcome to collaborate. The project is lead by Dr Haja Ratu

will be establish by Jigawa State government in Dutse, Nigeria, funded by government and NGO through PPP basis. The centre will be managed by local and international collaborators. FIMASAC

Save Heart: FIMA Save Heart Centre



The project has regularly conducted Inspire webinar series monthly, and annual student camp and umrah program. 23rd Student Camp on 2-6 August 2025 in Sei Rock Beach Resort in Mombasa, Kenya 14th Umrah Program on 4-8 January 2025, 50 female only participants from 14 countries Coming program: Male only Umrah 9-15 January 2026, and Student Camp 1-5 August 2026

FIMA Yearbook, report by Dr. Musa Yearbook 2024 managed to publish 8 articles out of 12 pledged. Yearbook 2025 will carry the theme: Health Policy and Islamic Governance: Bridging Ethics and Public Health. Call for authors have been disseminated.

FIMA Mind Care project envisage to promote mental wellness and reduce stigma associated with mental illness in Muslim communities. Programs include educational workshops and seminars, youth engagement programs, annual global mental health awareness workshop. Pilot projects by BIMA, AIMA and KAMMP. Each IMA to appoint PIC to FIMA Mind Care

Safe Water report by Dr. Musa, Implemented in 80 locations in 6 countries. Supplying 865,000 liters of water every day to 310,000 people. FIMA Safe Water initiative installed a number of water plants in Gaza, as all the previously installed plants were destroyed. This year we did at least 6 wells in Gaza. Gaza Relief of FIMA includes Main partners: AKFP-PIMA, DWWT, IMANA, IMARET Aids are not allowed into Gaza from West Bank, the prospects are still very uncertain. NGO must register for UN approval to enter Gaza. We also need to have updated needs analysis, training and resources within the UN approved NGO. Al Khidmat has successfully delivered the badly needed food items and medical supplies through the courtesy of Pakistan and Jordanian Governments. It was proposed that FIMA should strengthen advocacy in its capacity of being an independent medical organization with UN and other global institution. DWWT can

send physical facilities if Rafah border is open. Now focus on rehabilitation and psychological support.

CIMCO report was presented by Dr. Iwang Yusuf, the project is maintaining IJHHS website. Coordinate with Palmed Academy for continuation of Palestinian medical student education. Collaborate with Aasim Padela team on Bioscience and Islamic theology projects.

IJHHS report was presented by Dr Abu Kholdun, the Journal has been published regularly, getting many articles from around the world. Publication and citation showing uptrend growth. Still need many more articles and further increase ranking. IMAs urged to share and cite from the journal.

FIMA-HIM (History of Islamic Medicine) under the leadership of Dr. Shareef from BIMA, conducted 7 webinars between 2024-2025. Presented about HIM at FIMASAC, Student Camp in Mombasa and CIMCO Symposium in Banda Aceh. Subscribers and viewers showing uptrend growth.

Lifesaver has a new international director appointed: Mohammed Khanji (BIMA) replacing Dr. Wajid Akhter. 22 countries confirmed participation in 2025. This year Lifesaver will be conducted simultaneously on Saturday 27 September 2025. Urging all IMAs to participate in this high impact project.

IHC (Islamic Hospital, Consortium, report was presented by Dr. Ishak Masud, This year marked 20th anniversary of the project. From its early emphasis on patient worship facilitation and ethical guidance, the movement has evolved into three mutually reinforcing streams of practice and accreditation: Ibadah Friendly Hospital, Islamic Hospital, and Shariah Compliant Hospital. Main players: Malaysia, Indonesia, Pakistan, Bangsamoro, Nigeria.

Social Media report was presented by Dr Asiya , the project is currently

active on Instagram and Facebook. Main channel for branding awareness and membership recruitment, especially among young people. Growth spurt observed after Student Camp and Council Meeting events.

Beat of the Heart is actively sending aid, powered by Jordan medical association. 57 Gazan third year medical student currently in Malaysia for 1 year, another good number are now settled in Pakistan and all the expenses are borne by AL Khidmat and PIMA.

FIMA RIPE – This new initiative will be lead by Dr. Iqbal Khan from PIMA Research, Innovation and Entrepreneurship. Muslim countries have striking growth rates. Capabilities available in each country vis a vis their potential in leading scientific research and innovation. Need to build awareness on self-reliance through indigenization in Muslim countries. Establishment of partnerships among Muslim countries and Muslim professionals across the Globe. Establish a platform to help collaborate and work together.

Adib, SpOT (LK-MUI FKK UMJ Indonesia) Moderator of the session was Dr. Ida Royani.

The last session of CIMCO symposium started with presentation: "Towards a Holistic Islamic Medical Curriculum: Integration of Islamic Knowledge in Medical Training – Experiences from Islamic University in Uganda" by Dr. Naziru Rashid (Faculty of Health Sciences, Islamic University in Uganda). A talk on "The Innovations and Advancements in the Golden Era of the Islamic Civilization was the topic of a very interesting talk, made by the guest speaker from UK , Prof. Sharif Kaf Al-Ghazal (International Society for the History of Islamic Medicine/ ISHIM), the past president OF British IMA. Dr. Umatul Khairiyah, Ph.D was the moderator of the session.

The 20th IHC (Islamic Hospital Consortium) seminar was held on 6th September in the auditorium of Rumah

Sakit Umum Daerah Zainoel Abidin, Banda Aceh. The theme of symposium was, "Strengthening of commitment of Maqasid el Shariahin healthcare delivery. Dr. Isra Firmansyah, Director of Zainoel Abidin regional hospital greeted and welcomed the delegates and gave an excellent presentation on "Overview of Shariah Hospital governance in Indonesia. The backbone and chair of FIMA IHC Dr. Ishak Masud had a talk on Ibadah friendly hospital: A 20 year journey. Prof. Dr. Omar H. Kassule, professor King Fahad Medical city, Riyadh made an insightful insight on Applications of maqasid Shariah/Qawaaid Al-Faqihyah in Islamic Hospital. Dr. Sherjan Kalim from Philippines shared his experience of Ibadah friendly hospitals in Philippines. Dr. Salisu Ismail from Nigeria also shared the local experience of Ibadah friendly hospitals in Nigeria. RESOLUTION

FIMA Announces Landmark Resolution for Families of Martyred Healthcare Workers in Gaza.

Banda Aceh, Indonesia – September 05, 2025 – In a historic and compassionate move, the Federation of Islamic Medical Associations (FIMA), convened at its Annual Council Meeting in Banda Aceh, today passed a resolution to provide sustained humanitarian support for the families of healthcare workers who have been martyred in the ongoing crisis in Gaza.

The resolution, championed by FIMA and led by its member organization, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan, establishes a monthly sustenance allowance for the families of the 1,560 doctors, nurses, paramedics, and other medical personnel who have lost their lives while serving the wounded and sick in Gaza.

Under this initiative, each affected family will receive a monthly allowance of £ 100. This sustained financial support is aimed at alleviating the immediate economic hardship faced by the dependents of these heroes, ensuring they have access to basic necessities such as food, shelter, and medicine.

The passing of this resolution marks a significant milestone in global medical solidarity. Islamic Medical Associations (IMAs) representatives from over 50 countries stood united in acknowledging the immense sacrifice of their colleagues in Gaza and affirming their duty to support the families they left behind.

“Our healthcare brethren in Gaza have written a new chapter in medical heroism with their blood and sacrifice. They stood firm in their oath to serve the wounded, even as their own hospitals were bombed and their own lives were taken,” said Prof. Dr. Hafeez ur Rahman, the Executive Director of FIMA and President of Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan. “This resolution is our solemn duty—a small token to honor their immense sacrifice and ensure their loved ones are not forgotten. We pray to Allah to alleviate their grief, protect their families, and bless their patience and perseverance.”

Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan, with its extensive experience in humanitarian aid and disaster management, will lead the operational implementation of the program, working through trusted channels on the ground to ensure the aid reaches its intended beneficiaries efficiently and transparently.

FIMA calls upon the international community, NGOs, and people of conscience worldwide to recognize the scale of this tragedy and to support efforts aimed at protecting healthcare workers and civilians in conflict zones.


