BOSNIAN IMA ENTERS ITS 25TH YEAR OF FOUNDATION, PLEDGES TO HOST FIMA COUNCIL MEETING IN 2025 IN SARAJEVO

BIMA is the largest and most organized humanitarian medical association in Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as in the Balkans and beyond in South East Europe. Its hundredth jubilee action throughout B&H proves that as an indisputable fact. This year, BIMA (Bosnian Islamic medical association) is a candidate for the biggest award of the capital of B&H in April for selfless work, helping the sick across the country and abroad.

Bosnia and Herzegovina is a country situated in the western Balkan Peninsula of Europe. It survived one of the worst wars in the history of the world during 1992-1995, and certainly Europe. Over 120,000 killed, missing and as many wounded and war invalids, and about a million displaced. Thirty of thousands of raped women and children killed along with convicted war crimes and genocide in Srebrenica.

BIMA is a medical association that brings together medical professionals and enthusiasts who are willing to help by voluntarily investing their knowledge and time. The Association of Citizens "BIMA" is a non-governmental and non-political association, formed on October 31, 1998.

REMAINING BOSNIAN IMA ENTERS ITS 25TH YEAR OF FOUNDATION, PLEDGES TO HOST FIMA COUNCIL MEETING IN 2025 IN SARAJEVO

BIMA is a non-governmental, nonprofit association of medical workers that provides health care to the uninsured population, mostly refugees-returnees throughout Bosnia and Herzegovina. The staff that supports the work of BIMA consists of doctors, dentists, pharmacists, radiologists, medical laboratory technicians, nurses, physiotherapists, veterinarians and students of medicine, dentistry, pharmacy and veterinary medicine.

The common basic goals of the work are: caring for the unity and wellbeing of medical professionals in Bosnia and Herzegovina, mobilizing professional and economic resources to provide medical care and assistance to affected areas and people, spreading health culture by organizing lectures, symposia and meetings, voluntary action, going to professional meetings and congresses as well as organizing them, strengthening cooperation among researchers dealing with health and medical issues for the benefit of the people and the state of Bosnia and Herzegovina.


Every action is very demanding organizationally. It means transporting the entire activity from Sarajevo to the target place, where people, diagnostic machines, medicines and other things necessary for the action are transported. At the same time, one "polyclinic" is placed in a stationary building in one day, and after the action is over, everything needs to be returned to Sarajevo. Some of our participants come from other cities.

Each of our actions involves organizing a team consisting of doctors of medicine, dentistry and veterinary medicine, pharmacists, laboratory experts, and students of health studies and associated volunteers. Our team of usually fifty people goes to returnee settlements where, in agreement with the local community, they are stationed in a local facility that adapts to population surveys.

Teams of different specialties, together with diagnostic devices, are housed in different rooms in the facility. We usually have a triage team, internal medicine specialists, dental team, pediatric team, ophthalmology specialist, ultrasound specialist, pharmacy, field veterinary team, etc. All teams

are joined by students who acquire new knowledge and skills. Associated volunteers are our great strength, they help the whole structure to function in the best possible way.

In these large scale activities, over 70,000 people, women and sick children were examined by specialist examinations and over 30,000 services of laboratory tests, ultrasound examinations, ECG, dental or veterinary interventions.

For these 23 years, several hundred doctors, mostly specialists, dentists, laboratory technicians, veterinarians, pharmacists, medical nurses and pediatric nurses, medical and dental students, as well as volunteers of various professions, have participated in these actions. All this represents a great quality where the participants in our faith in Islam have shown a great degree of unity and sacrifice. All people were examined regardless of nationality, religion, race, gender or economic

status. There were many among the doctors who belonged to other religions and nations, so in a wise way this difficult task was performed in the right way. BIMA examined refugees and migrants outside its country in neighboring countries and thus did this important task. The education of women was an important task of BIMA. In the Covid-19 pandemic, it held a large number of educational webinars and provided humanitarian assistance primarily to medical professionals in

equipment and laboratory diagnostics.

MUSLIM DOCTORS RUN FOURTH ANNUAL NATIONAL BLOOD DRIVE

The Australian Islamic Medical Association will be coordinating an urgently needed national blood donation drive.

20 February 2022, The Australian Islamic Medical Association (AIMA) will be running a blood donation drive on Friday, the 25th of February in collaboration with the Australian Red Cross.

The recent increase in COVID-19 infection rates in Australia has stopped an estimated 100,000 regular donors from giving blood. The Red Cross estimates that 20 percent of donors have been unable to donate on any given day in recent weeks due to record numbers of people isolating or currently unwell with COVID-19.

However, demand for blood supplies remains high because even in the midst of a pandemic there are still cancer patients, trauma cases, pregnant women and unborn babies who all require donated blood.

To address this shortage, the Red Cross has issued a plea for new and existing blood donors to come off the bench. AIMA has heard this plea and its members and supporters are ready to bat in aid of the Red Cross.

Building on a very successful third annual event in 2021, when more than 500 donors participated, AIMA will once again coordinate community blood donation drives thru 43 Mosques and Islamic centers in all d Australian States and Terrotiries to encourage eligible donors to easily make donations.

"This is a really simple and easy way to make a big difference. As doctors we see the critical important of one unit of blood in saving not one, but multiple lives," said President of AIMA, Dr.

Muhammad Kahloon. "We are very proud of how our annual blood donation initiative has grown, and the enthusiasm with which our members and supporters participate."

The blood drive will be held on 25 February, Friday Prayer time.

Note: you only need to be clear of COVID-19 symptoms for seven days to donate.
