

## 12TH UMRAH CAMP FOR MEDICAL STUDENTS HELD IN HOLY CITIES OF SAUDI ARABIA SUCCESSFULLY BY WAMY-IMAKSA AND FIMA

12th Umrah for medical students was organized and hosted by Islamic medical association in kingdom Saudi Arabia (IMAKSA) and World Assembly of Muslim Youth (WAMY) in collaboration with Federation of Islamic medical associations students affairs chapter (FIMASAC) from 13th -17th January 2023. The camp was conducted in both holy cities of Medina and Makkah el Mukaramah.

Medical students from Pakistan, Indonesia, Malaysia, UK, Uganda, Kenya, Somaliland, Bangladesh, Turkey, Palestine, KSA, Jordan and Ghana attended. Participating students (including female students) were nominated by their respective IMAs.

The delegates from different countries were warmly welcomed at the airport.

The accommodation in Makkah and Medina were Provided close to Haram for the convenience especially the female students. Male and female students were segregated nicely and were divided into groups each having three to four students from different countries. Room allocation was also Group wise to encourage mutual interaction and foster friendship and augment

relationship based on faith.

During this program, participants were taken to different historical and holy places in Medina & Makkah including visits to different museums and Quran printing complex etc.

After Isha prayer, social programs were arranged on daily basis on different locations. During visits to Holy places, professional





















guides were there to brief detailed history of these holy places. Students performed Umra in groups.



# FREE SURGERIES AT DEDZA AND NTCHEU DISTRICT HOSPITALS, COURTESY OF ISLAMIC HEALTH ASSOCIATION OF MALAWI (IHAM)

A team of 13 specialist doctors from Jordan and Palestine is in the country conducting free surgeries at Dedza and Ntcheu district hospitals, courtesy of Islamic Health Association of Malawi (IHAM).

They are set to complete the initiative this coming Wednesday.

The doctors embarked on the initiative on Saturday last week, targeting 100 patients with hernia,

hydroceles, ganglion cysts and thyroids among others in the two districts.

IHAM executive director, Hajj Daitoni said the aim of the initiative is to help government treatpatients at their nearest facilities, where there is normally a lack of specialized medics.

Ntcheu district medical officer, Dr. William Chimsanga and the wife of one of the beneficiaries of the

initiative in Ntcheu Kate Sosola lauded the initiative as timely.


