WORKSHOP ON ROLE OF WOMEN IN MEDICAL COMMUNITY HELD AT MEDICAL COLLEGE OF ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY OF GAZZA

A one day workshop was held under the auspices of Medical College of Islamic University of Gazza on the role of Women in Medical community. Prof Dr Fadel Naeem, Dean of the Medical faculty was the coordinator.

The empowerment and inclusion of women in the medical profession are vital for building a diverse and equitable healthcare system. To recognize the importance of addressing women's role in the medical community, emphasizing the significance of women's participation and leadership in the medical field, highlighting the contributions of women, and having conversations about the unique work-life balance of women in medicine, the "Woman and Their Role in the Medical Community" workshop was organized by 4th year female medical students. This report aims to provide an overview of the workshop, its objectives, key discussions, outcomes, and the significance of 4th year female medical students successfully accomplishing such a workshop.





Workshop Objectives

The workshop aimed to:

- Highlight the valuable contributions and perspectives that women bring to healthcare.
- Foster dialogue on what equality and inclusivity means in an Islamic community and the role of women in shaping the medical profession.
- Inspire and motivate the next generation of female medical professionals.
- Provides unique and valuable insight into the challenges, a c c o m p l i s h m e n t s, a n d breakthroughs of women who paved the way for future generations of female doctors.
- Provide practical guidance, strategies, and resources from senior female health professionals to support future female medical professionals.
- Create a platform for networking, mentorship, and collaboration among participants.

Workshop Overview

The workshop spanned a full day, featuring a diverse range of activities, including keynote speeches, panel discussions, interactive Q&A sessions,





presentations, and networking opportunities. Participants consisted of medical students, practicing physicians, healthcare administrators, and prominent female figures from various healthcare fields.

Key Discussions

The workshop aimed to address important topics such as women leadership, equality, perceptions, experiences, accomplishments, work-life balance, and the advantages of having female doctors in the medical staff. The following sections provide a summary of the key discussions held for each topic.

Women Leadership and Decision Making in Health Care


ISLAMIC HOSPITAL WORKSHOP BY AHF

GROUP SIGHTSEEING PROGRAM

Group sightseeing program for the FIMA and International delegates will be held after lunch on the 29th of October 2023. We will bring the group to tour the city of Putrajaya, one of the federal administrative capitals in Malaysia.

✓ THE EIGHT BRIDGES.

The Sri Perdana Bridge boasts Moorish influences whilst the Seri Wawasan Bridge offers a more contemporary design, making it easily one of the most iconic landmarks of Putrajaya. The other notable bridges, namely the Seri Wawasan Bridge, Sri Saujana Bridge and the Seri Gemilang Bridge are popular with photographers, even more so at night when each of them is lit-up, providing a welcome contrast to the city.

✓ THE MAN-MADE LAKE

The centre piece of Putrajaya remains its vast man-made lake. The Putrajaya Lake measures in at over 650-hectares and was designed as a natural cooling system for the city.

✓ THE ICONIC MOSQUE

The pink coloured Putra Mosque is perhaps the most recognisable monument in the city. Located at the edge of the Putrajaya Lake the mosque was completed in early September 1999 and utilised Middle Eastern as well as traditional Malay design elements.

✓ THE INTELLIGENT GARDEN CITY

Putrajaya also houses a number of green initiatives which have made it an intelligent garden city. Along with the Botanical Park, which features landscaped grounds and numerous plant species, there are several parks in the vicinity, which collectively act as a green lung for the city.

The delegates will spend half-day on the evening of 29th October 2023 by touring the Putrajaya city and after Maghrib prayers, the tour will end and those having return flights on the same day will be taken to the International Airport.


