FIMA HOLDS ITS 42ND COUNCIL MEETING AND FIMA-IMASA SCIENTIFIC CONVENTION IN CAPE TOWN, SOUTH AFRICA

42nd FIMA Council meeting was held on, 8-9th August 2024 at Hotel Charles, Cape Town, South Africa. The meeting started with recitation of the Holy Quran. Review of the last meeting was made followed by a Report from President, Exco and Regional Directors presented by Dr. Abdul Rashid Abdul Rahman, FIMA 2030 Strategic Planning implementation and monitoring was presented by Dr. Eka Ginanger. It was followed by FIMA financial report, IMA activity report, Projects activity report, Update on Gaza Aid, Amendments of the constitution, Presentation of new IMA, Preparation for Convention 2025 followed Housekeeping announcements and other matters were also on the agenda list.

The individual reports of IMAs were presented and included: Australia IMA, British IMA, IMA Burundi (online), IMA DR Congo (online), Muslim Healthcare Worker Association of Ghana, Indonesia IMA, Islamic Hospital Jordan, Jordan Society of Islamic Medical Sciences, Kenya Association of Muslim Medical Professionals (KAMMP), Islamic Health Association of Malawi, IMA Malaysia, IMA Nigeria, IMA North America, Pakistan IMA, Al Khidmat Foundation Pakistan, IMA Palestine, IMA Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, Muslim Health Professional Association Singapore (online) Somaliland IMA, IMA South Africa, Hayat Foundation Turkiye Doctors Worldwide Turkiye and IMA Uganda.

Opening of the meeting commenced with the recitation of the Quran, Surah Al Isra was recited with its translation and Welcoming speech from IMASA President Dr. Faisal Suleman. Introduction of delegates and observers was carried out. Minutes of 39th FIMA Council Exco Meeting were read and matters arising from the agenda were discussed.

FIMA President report was followed by Dr Eka's presentation on "Look at what we have achieved from last year's strategic plan, adopt the TQM approach. Align FIMA, Project and IMA in vision 2030". It was told to the house that the field hospital in Gaza with OIC is still pending due to volatile and unfavorable circumstances inside the war torn Gaza. There is a need to finalize the roadmap for the field hospital. We've to establish a pathway for uninterrupted training for

Gazan medical students, IMA to take part in GEM.

FIMA financial report was presented by Dr. Ashraf Jedaar, FIMA Save Dignity report was presented by Hajara Umar from IMA of Nigeria. FIMA provided USD10,000 for this project last year. Project has been conducted successfully throughout Africa. IMANA and Al Khidmat pledge to raise for VVF repair. Project team to document and publish,

and submit for award.

FIMA Lifesaver project, although running successfully, is facing stagnation. FIMA Lifesaver should upgrade itself from just teaching CPR to initiate fundraising to get AED for each masjid. The program may be held in different places and locations: schools/shopping malls etc.

FIMA Save Vision report was presented





































by Prof Intzar Butt and he appraised the house that the project team is regularly conducting eye camps and training programs in African countries. It was proposed that the project team submit an application for the King Faisal Award, in category 5: Medicine and Science.

FIMASAC has regularly conducted Inspire webinar series monthly, and annual student camp and umrah program. Next program will be on: 8-15 November

2024 student camp in Amanah Resort Karanganyar Indonesia. The dates for FIMA-IAMASA umrah camp were decided from 4-8 January 2025 and it would be exclusively for female students this year.

Amendments to the Constitution were presented by Dr. Musa Nordin and include: ARTICLE X: MEETINGS 10.1: The Council and Executive Committee shall meet at least once a year. The Council Meetings can be physical, inperson meetings alternating annually with online and/or hybrid Council meetings. Annual Council meetings are alternated between physical face to face meetings and online meetings. Face to face council meeting undertaken during the period of election of Exco. The FIMA council did not approve the amendment

to the constitution.

Nominations were invited for FIMA lifetime achievement award, the names of Dr. Ata allah Ruhaily, Dr. Tanveer Zubairi and Dr. Majid Kagimu was proposed.

42nd FIMA annual convention will be held in Band Ache, Indonesia to be hosted by the Faculty of Medicine Universitas Syiah Kuala in Banda Aceh, Aceh, Indonesia. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair followed by dua.



SPEAKER: Prof. Dr. Hafeez ur Rahman

- President, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan

Prof. Dr. Hafeez ur Rahman is a Consultant Ophthalmologist and is currently serving as the President of Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan and Dean of Health Sciences, at Peshawar Medical College. Prof. Dr. Hafeez ur Rahman completed his MBBS from Rawalpindi Medical College in 1982. He worked as a registrar at General Hospital Rawalpindi and subsequently served as Associate Dean and Principal at International Islamic Medical College, Islamabad.

In recognition of his services, Rawalpindi Medical College honored him as one of the best doctors in the past 25 years during the Silver Jubilee celebrations. He was awarded the Best Achievement Award. Prof. Dr. Hafeez ur Rahman has also served as General Secretary and President of the Pakistan Islamic Medical Association (PIMA) and through POB (Prevention of Blindness Trust), millions of people in several countries across the world, including the backward areas of Pakistan, have been helped so far.

In addition to his services in Pakistan, he was elected as a member of the Central Executive Council of the Federation of Islamic Medical Association (FIMA) He has served as the first International Relief Coordinator and Secretary General of FIMA and currently holds the position of Executive Director. He is the founder and director of FIMA's "FIMA SAVE VISION" program and has overseen its implementation in over 20 countries worldwide for several years.

SPFAKER: Dr Osman Fhrahim

Dr Ebrahim is an accomplished Physician who has dedicated himself to the management of people with HIV infection since 1998. He has built a large practice at Brenthurst Hospital, Parktown, Johannesburg, where currently some 8000 patients are under regular follow up. His work includes the management of complex cases including HIV-associated opportunistic infections, HIV-associated malignancies, drug-drug interactions, comorbidities and HIV resistance. His practice is the key referral point for GP's, general physicians and surgeons, and other specialists for the management of HIV-related complications. He is an Honorary Senior lecturer, School of Therapeutic Sciences at

WITS and Dept of Microbiology, University of Pretoria. He graduated with MBChB, M(Med), MD from UCT and has a Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene from WITS. He is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians (Glasg). He holds Fellowships of the Royal Society of Tropical Medicine & Hygiene (UK) and the College of Medicine (SA). He is registered as a specialist in Clinical Pharmacology & Therapeutics both in SA and the UK. He carried out post-doctoral research at The Institute of Molecular Medicine, University of Oxford and worked with Nobel Laureate Professor Sir Peter Ratcliffe on "Oxygen Sensing and the Erythropoetin Gene". He is currently involved in "Functional Cure Research" with Professor Caroline Tiemessen of the National Institute of Communicable Diseases and has a number of recent publications on HIV Functional Cure Research.

In recognition of "His compassionate care of people with HIV/AIDS and improvements in HIV treatment through research and teaching", he was awarded the Ellen Kuzwavo Award by the University of Johannesburg.



SPEAKER: A/Prof Rene Krause

A/Prof Krause is a Family Physician with a master's degree in Palliative Medicine and a postgraduate diploma in Health Professional education. She is currently the Head of the Division of Interdisciplinary Palliative Care and Medicine in the Department of Family Medicine, Community and Emergency Care (University of Cape Town) and convenor of the postgraduate diploma in Palliative Medicine. She assists in the 6th year of lecturing and supervision during the rotation in Family Medicine. She also supervises Masters' students in Palliative Medicine and supervises registrars of Family Medicine during their Palliative Medicine rotation. Clinically, A/Prof Krause has an honorary appointment at Groote Schuur hospital, consulting in palliative care. In Groote Schuur Hospital, she works alongside the oncology team, doing combined ward rounds and consulting in palliative care across this 900-bed hospital. Dr Krause is a board member of the African Palliative Care Association and PalPrac, the South African Palliative Medicine Practitioner's Association.

A/Prof Krause's research interest is the strengthening and integration of Palliative Care practices in hospitals. A/Prof Krause is doing a PhD in integrating palliative care in academic teaching hospitals within the Department of Family Medicine at UCT.



SPEAKER: Dr Rivaz Rahbeeni

Dr Riyaz Rahbeeni completed his degree in dentistry in 1986 at the University of the Western Cape. After graduation, Dr Rahbeeni was offered an academic position in the Department of Restorative Dentistry at UWC. Starting out as a junior lecturer in 1987, he progressed through the ranks to senior lecturer and eventually senior specialist in 2006. The time spent in this department was focused on the teaching of both undergraduate as well as post-graduate students, and clinical research at the university.

After many years, he felt the urge to pursue his MChD speciality in Prosthodontics - his lifelong passion - in 2001, after which he continued in academia whilst engaging in limited private practice. In 2006, with his desire to maintain academic contact with UWC, he continued as a part-time clinical consultant Prosthodontist at the university on a sessional basis whilst practising fulltime as a Specialist Prosthodontist with a private practice in Durbanville, Cape Town.



SPEAKER: Dr Shabir Cassim

Dr. Shabir Cassim earned his BCh.D degree from the University of the Western Cape in 1984. Following a successful stint as a private practitioner, he assumed leadership of the dental department at R K Khan Hospital in Durban. Driven by his passion for Prosthodontics, he obtained his MCh.D from the University of the Western Cape

In addition to his Prosthodontist credentials, Dr Cassim holds a postgraduate Diploma in Odontology from the University of Pretoria and a Postgraduate Diploma in Dentistry from the University of Stellenbosch.

His professional journey took him to Madinah Munawara, Saudi Arabia, where he practiced as a prosthodontic consultant for three years. Upon his return he was appointed as a consultant at the Dental Faculty of The University of the Western Cape in the Department of Prosthodontics. He taught advanced restorative techniques on natural teeth and dental implants to final year and postgraduate students

Alongside Dr. Thabit Peck, he co-managed the Postgraduate Diploma in Dentistry in Implantology at the University of the Western Cape.

While based in Cape Town, South Africa, he maintains a specialised prosthodontic practice.

SPEAKER: Dr Hassina Kajee

Dr. Hassina Kajee is a UCT trained Specialist Physician who has dedicated her career to addressing the rising concern of diseases related to insulin resistance and obesity. As the head of the High Care Unit of the EU at Groote Schuur Hospital, she recognized the importance of understanding insulin resistance and lifestyle medicine in combating these health issues in her community, when she noted the increase in acute medical admissions associated with obesity and insulin resistance.

Driven by her passion for improving health in underserved areas, she co-founded Eat Better South Africa with colleagues from The Noakes Foundation. Additionally, she is the co-founder and Medical Curriculum Director of Nutrition Network, a groundbreaking organization that educates healthcare providers and coaches on the science and application of ketogenic medicine.

Dr. Kajee's commitment to making a difference extends beyond her professional endeavors. She recently co-founded Sehha Centre, an online physician-led coaching program tailored for individuals of the Islamic faith. Her personal ethos of practicing what she preaches is evident in her daily life, as she prioritizes her own health and that of her young family.

As an editor and global author of the world's first textbook in Ketogenic Science, Dr. Hassina Kajee's expertise is widely recognized. She is dedication to bridging the gap between scientific understanding and practical application and promoting health, rather than treating disease, InShaAllah.

Dr. Tasneem Kharwa has extensive general practice experience spanning almost 2 decades, with a particular focus on obesity medicine. Senior Lecturer, Department of Surgery, Faculty of Clinical Sciences, College of Medicine and Allied Medical Sciences, Federal University Dutse and Consultant Cardiothoracic Surgeon Rasheed Shekoni University Teaching Hospital, Dutse Nigeria.


